
What Will I Learn in Ceramics?

As an artist, I can integrate the characteristics of the tools of a selected media in original artworks to support artistic purposes.



Surface decorating (sponging, spattering, masking)

Pinch and pull ● Coil ● Slip and Score ● Slab

Throw (pottery wheel) ● Drape or press mold

Extrude ● Slip cast ● Pull a handle


